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Registration Information

1. Please go to the **Waunakee Web Store**: <https://waunakee.revtrak.net/>
2. Login with your Account E-mail Address and Password or “Create New Account”
NOTE: You must use the same email address you receive your invoices from.
3. Click on the **Community Education** box, then the **Summer Program** box.
4. Along the left, click on the class you’d like to register your student for. Then click on the link in the body of the page.
5. On the upper right, under **Event Actions**, choose **Register for this Class**. On the next screen, you will choose who you are registering and confirm their contact information.
NOTE: If you don’t see the name of the family member you’d like to register, click on “A New Person” and then add their contact information.
6. The next screen will have you choose the participant’s grade, add their age, select their gender, list any medical concerns and grant permissions. At this point, you may choose **Add and Go To Shopping Cart** or **Add and Continue To Shop**.
7. Once you’ve added all of your classes to your shopping cart, you may check out:
Select **Cart** from the Navigation bar on the upper right side of your screen and **Checkout**.
8. Please complete any blank fields and verify your payment information, making changes as necessary, and then click **Place Order**. Please note that Registration(s) are not complete until the appropriate fee(s) are paid.

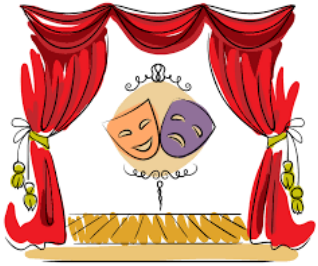

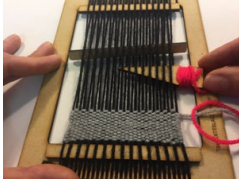

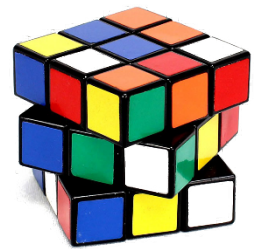

Babysitting Classes

Students must attend both full classes to become certified. This course will NOT certify the students in first aid and CPR, but will go over first aid and CPR basics.

Severe Weather

Do not send your child to class during the time a **tornado warning** is in effect. Students must remain in the designated shelter area until the warning is over.** If your child is at school, you are requested not to come to the school to take your child home. **Please wait until the warning is over before you pick up your child.**
